School Schedule

Classes starts each day with a **bell at 8:55 a.m.** There is a bell at 8:50 for students to go to classrooms. Our recess break is at **10:30 a.m.** and we dismiss for lunch at **12:00 noon.** Students return to class **at 12:45 p.m. and are dismissed for the day at 2:47 p.m.**

Late for School and Early Pick Up



It is really important that parents ensure that their children arrive to school on time each day. Lessons begin at 8:55 and those who arrive late not only miss valuable instructional time, but also disturb the learning of their classmates by entering their classrooms after everyone is settled. **Any student who arrives late, must first come to the school office to sign in, and then proceed to their classrooms.** If you are picking up your child(ren) before dismissal time, please come and sign them out at the office.

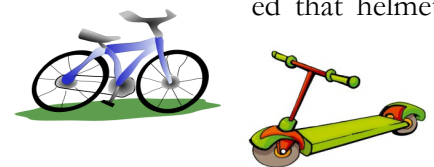
Safety Issues

Parking, Pick-up and Drop-off at the School

The heavy congestion of traffic that occurs each and every day around our school is a potentially hazardous situation. It is therefore important for all drivers to be very vigilant of all pedestrians, abide parking regulations and be respectful of each other. We thank you for your attention to this very important matter!

Wheeling to School

If students use scooters or skateboards to come to school, they must pick them up and carry them while on the school grounds. If students ride bicycles to school, they must walk them on the school grounds and lock them in the bike rack that are provided on our school property. Students are reminded that helmets should be worn when riding scooters, skateboards and bicycles.



When Walking to School Consider the following tips:

- Know the route your child takes to and from school and how long it takes.
- Encourage your child to walk with a friend or in a group. Know the names, telephone numbers and addresses of these friends.
- Identify places on the way to school that could be potentially dangerous: wooded areas, parking lots, underground walkways etc.
- Arrange for your child to arrive at school as close to the morning bell time as possible.
- Set a time for your child to report home after school.
- Encourage your child to wear light coloured clothing so that they are easily seen on rainy, dark days.
- Review street safety rules with your child.

West-Coast Recess – Please Dress for the Weather!

At Capitol Hill we believe it is healthy for children to get outside throughout the day for fresh air and exercise. Living on the West Coast we know that our climate contains a consistent amount of rainfall especially throughout the winter months. It makes sense that in our climate we are well prepared to be outside in the rain. Given that students will be outside for lunch and / recess even when it's raining it is important to send your child to school well prepared.

Being prepared for the weather

We know that if children are well prepared to be outside in the rain they actually enjoy it. As long as they stay dry and warm there is a great deal of fun to be had in all kinds of weather. To be prepared to be outside in the rain it is important for your child to have:

- A rain coat or water resistant covering
- Rubber boots to keep feet dry (if you are able to provide them with a pair to keep at school that would be perfect)
- “Muddy Buddies” – rain pants they can quickly slip over their clothes (much like they would snow pants)
- An umbrella
- A rain hat or coat with a hood
- A change of clothes just in case. (sweatpants, sock, underwear, t-shirt)

RainyWeather FAQ

I am concerned that my child will get sick being out in the rain.

It is not cold that makes us sick but rather viruses. “People get sick more often in the winter because they are exposed to each other more in the winter than in the summer. When it is cold outside people tend to stay inside are more likely to spread germs to one another.” (from “Does Cold Weather Cause the Cold or Flu?”). Turns out that getting outdoors is more likely to protect our children from illnesses than keeping them outdoors.



My child has been sick but is now returning to school. Can he stay inside today?

We are quite reluctant to allow this for a couple of reasons. First, if your child is still not quite better it would be better to keep him/her home until he/she is 100% ready to function fully at school. If he is too sick to go outside he is probably too sick to get through the day's work at school successfully - give him another day of rest. Secondly, we have very limited supervision inside so if more than of a couple of students are requesting this it becomes problematic. We do make exceptions to this based on special circumstances. Please contact your child's teacher to discuss this matter.

Are the Children ever allowed to stay inside due to the weather?

We occasionally have weather conditions that are unreasonable to expect students to stay outside. These days include hard, driving rain with extreme cold or wind. In these situations we intend to declare it an inside day, however, we do not expect to have more than two or three of these in a year.
